Nanomaterials:

Even though nanomaterials are covered by REACH, there is still no sufficient legislation or guidance to secure safe nanomaterials. Nanomaterials with different properties than their bulk counterpart should be subject to the same information requirements as one substance in one dossier. In general, nanomaterials should be regarded as substances on their own to ensure their safe use.

We appreciate the initiative from the Commission regarding the REACH implementation projects on nanomaterials.
